

<u>CHALLENGES</u>

- Multistakeholder coordination (Government, Private sector, Communities, NGO's) to reduce deforestation, protect forest and restore degraded forest;
- Develop an inclusive and incentive benefit sharing plan;
- Complex MRV setup to support benefit sharing;
- Long term funding to support activities and to maintain achievements;

LESSONS LEARNED

What work ?

- Jurisdictional scale created coherence and impact;
- Early and sustained community engagement built trust ;
- Carbon finance ensured long-term viability.

What can be improved ?

- Increase private sector engagement for scale and innovation;
- Use the nesting approach to better take into account and better value the sequestration efforts of actors and get the most out of them
- Strengthen institutional and legal frameworks (in progress);
